Malaria Commission.

The Medical Director has the honour to communicate herewith the resolutions adopted by the Malaria Commission at its session of October (13 - 14th.) 1933.

During this session the Commission examined :

- 1) The conclusions of the Reporting Committee and the the Report on Malaria in Siam , by Dr. L. Anigstein.
- 2) The reports of the sub-Committee on Alkaloids concerning :
 - a) the enquiry into quinine requirements,
 - b) the report of the Experts on the Standardisation and Analysis of Totaquina, (CH/Malaria/183)
- 3) as well as the others subjects contained in the Report by the President of the Malaria Commission (CH/Malaria/181).

After discussion, the Commission adopted the following resolutions :

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED BY THE MALARIA COMMISSION AT ITS MEETING

(October 12, 13 and 14 1932)

The Malaria Commission having taken note of the work outlined in the report of the President of the Commission, submits the following resolutions for the approval of the Health Committee:

SIAM : The Malaria Commission, after having considered the very detailed report of Dr. Anigstein and the practical conclusions drawn therefrom by the Reporting Committee, associates itself with the recommendations of Dr. Anigstein and is of opinion that the report should be sent to the Government of Siam, together with the conclusions of the Reporting Committee.

CHINA: The Commission notes with satisfaction the organization of the Malaria Division attached to the Central Field Station of Nanking.

MALARIA COURSES: The Commission is of opinion that the Directors of the Malaria Schools and the Directors of the Field Work in connection with malaria courses should be consulted as to the possible modification of these courses.

MALARIA COURSES IN THE FAR EAST:

The Commission having examined the Note CH/Malaria/178, expresses the opinion that it would be ^{very} useful to institute a malaria course for the Far East, at Singapore .

ENQUIRY INTO QUININE REQUIREMENTS:

The Commission thanks the 108 sanitary administrations and the experts who have kindly sent information on quinine requirements, is of opinion that the documentation received can serve as a basis for a future conference on quinine in accordance with the conclusions of the Reporting Committee and expresses the wish that this Conference might be held as soon as possible.

TOTAQUINA : The Commission expresses its thanks to the Experts who have kindly undertaken to establish the protocols of chemical and biological analysis of totaquina, is of opinion that it could recommend these protocols to the Pharmacopeias of the interested countries and suggests that investigations into human malaria should be undertaken in accordance with the resolutions of the Alkaloids Sub-Committee.

COORDINATED STUDIES:

The Commission expresses the wish that its next meeting will take place in the first quarter of 1932. This meeting should be specially devoted to the examination of reports furnished by the Reporting Committees nominated in order to acquaint themselves with studies relating to the three following problems under investigation :

- 1) Various treatments of malaria
- 2) Housing and Malaria,
- 3) Malaria in Deltas.

DARLING PRIZE:

The Commission will have to consider the merits of the candidates proposed for the Darling Prize and will refer the results to the Darling Committee.
