Meeting of members of the Malaria Commission attending
the Third International Congress of Tropical Medicine
and Malaria, September, 1938.

Note by the Secretariat.

At its 26th session, in November 1937, the Health Committee proposed to the Council that on the occasion of the Third International Conference on Tropical Medicine and Malaria, Amsterdam, those members of the Malaria Commission who attend the Congress should be given an opportunity of meeting to discuss the current work of the Commission. This proposal was adopted by the Council at its 100th session in January 1938.
