1. Terms of Reference of the Committee  
(Document WHO.IC/183, Rev.1)
2. Resolutions adopted in the field of malaria by the Interim Commission at its fourth and fifth sessions (Documents WHO.IC/124, Rev. 1 and WHO.IC/183, Rev. 1)
3. Programme on malaria drawn up by the Interim Commission at its fifth session, for submission to the First World Health Assembly  
(Document WHO.IC/181, Add.1)
4. Planning of malaria control in the world:
  - (a) in general;
  - (b) in areas where mass attack is most needed from the standpoint of incidence of malaria and/or from the standpoint of the development of agricultural and economic productivity;
  - (c) methods by which the WHO could foster malaria control and/or eradication of malaria in general, and particularly in the above-mentioned areas.
    - i. Names of experts to be suggested with a view to helping governments desirous of improving their antimalarial policy;
    - ii. Possibilities for training in malariology and for placement of fellows;
    - iii. Selection of personnel for demonstration teams and for field work;
    - iv. Programme for such teams;
    - v. Education of the public.

5. Insecticides.

- (a) Can recently introduced insecticides be relied on as a basis for a widespread attack on malaria with expectation of a significant reduction of morbidity in areas where they are properly used?
- (b) Are these insecticides available in sufficient quantities for a widespread attack? If not, what steps might be taken to ensure their increased production?
- (c) What are the insecticides preferred, and how can they best be employed on a mass-basis?
- (d) How does the price of insecticides affect malaria control campaigns?

6. (Referred to the Expert Committee on Malaria by the Expert Committee on International Epidemic Control)

Draft International Agreement aiming at preventing importation of anopheles in an island (Sardinia) where eradication of anopheles has been achieved or is in progress. (Documents WHO.IC/Epid./3, WHO.IC/Mal./21 and WHO.IC/Mal./22)

7. Chemotherapeutics.

- (a) Present-day knowledge on the use and posology of modern chemotherapeutics;
- (b) Part that modern chemotherapeutics can play in antimalaria action;

8. Research: problems on which research can be made on an international plane.

9. Expert Committee on Malaria and "corresponding Members" (Document WHO.IC/140).

10. Draft resolutions to be submitted to the First World Health Assembly.
