

6.1.5 EXECUTIVE BOARD SPECIAL FUND

For previous resolutions, see Volume I, page 401.

WHA29.29 The Twenty-ninth World Health Assembly,

Recalling resolutions WHA7.24 and EB15.R59;

Noting that the amount of US \$100 000, being the established level of the Executive Board Special Fund, has been expended for the purchase of supplies and equipment urgently required for the provision of safe water supply for the victims of the Guatemala earthquake;

- 1. CONCURS in the Director-General's recommendation to bring the Executive Board Special Fund to its established level of US \$100 000 by transferring this amount from casual income available at 31 December 1975;
2. AUTHORIZES the Director-General to transfer US \$100 000 from casual income available at 31 December 1975 to the Executive Board Special Fund to reimburse the Fund for the expenditure incurred for the purchase of supplies and equipment to be used towards restoring a safe water supply for the victims of the Guatemala earthquake in 1976, thereby bringing the credit in the Fund to its established amount of US \$100 000.

6.1.6 REVOLVING FUNDS

EB51.R32 The Executive Board,

Recognizing that the acquisition of medical literature through the Revolving Fund for Teaching and Laboratory Equipment for Medical Education and Training would be of great assistance to those Members that have difficulty in obtaining convertible currencies; and

Having considered the report by the Director-General on the extension of the use of the fund for such purposes, 1

RECOMMENDS to the Twenty-sixth World Health Assembly the adoption of the following resolution: 2

WHA26.25 The Twenty-sixth World Health Assembly,

Recognizing that shortage of medical literature is a serious obstacle to the improvement of medical education, to post-graduate training and to the development of medical research, especially in developing countries; and

Having considered the report of the Director-General 1 and the recommendation of the Executive Board thereon,

DECIDES that the Revolving Fund for Teaching and Laboratory Equipment for Medical Education and Training established by the Nineteenth World Health Assembly (resolution WHA19.7) may be used by Members also for the purchase of medical literature subject to the conditions for such use set forth in the report of the Director-General.

6.1.7 REAL ESTATE FUND

EB51.R50 The Executive Board,

Noting the report of the Director-General regarding the status of the Real Estate Fund and of the projects being financed from it by authorization of the World Health Assembly; 1

Having reviewed the experience of the Fund during its first three years of operation, as requested by the Health Assembly in resolution WHA23.14;

Noting with satisfaction the experience of the Fund during this period;

Noting in particular that various important unforeseen increases in costs have been compensated by interest earnings on the Fund so that, according to present estimates, no additional appropriations are needed at this time to meet the needs of the next twelve-month period;

Recalling its recommendation to the Twenty-fifth World Health Assembly in resolution EB49.R34 that available casual income in excess of immediate requirements for financing the budget and supplementary estimates be appropriated to the Real Estate Fund in order to build up credits for the construction of the permanent addition to the headquarters building if approved; and

Noting that the Health Assembly, in its resolution WHA25.38, accepted this recommendation and acted on it by appropriating to the Fund casual income available at that time,

- 1. INVITES the attention of the Twenty-sixth World Health Assembly to the satisfactory experience of the Fund during its first three years of operation;

- 2. RECOMMENDS to the Twenty-sixth World Health Assembly that it again appropriate to the Real Estate Fund any balance of casual income remaining after deduction of any sums appropriated to help finance the 1974 budget and the supplementary estimates for 1973 in order to augment the credits for the construction of the permanent addition to the headquarters building, if approved.
